Bargaining for Justice

Members of FLOC have used collective bargaining to exercise their power in the agricultural industry and achieve better wages and working conditions. By using three way negotiations among processor, farmers, and farmworkers, FLOC has been able to:

- Raise wages and benefits for farmworkers in the pickle industry
- Improve migrant housing for workers
- Protect our members against pesticide poisoning beyond EPA standards
- Give workers the ability to defend their rights through a grievance procedure
- Create a seniority system and improve corrupt recruiting practices

The Tobacco Campaign

In September 2007, FLOC launched a campaign to secure justice for tens of thousands of fields hands who plant, cultivate and harvest North Carolina's tobacco crop. As it did with Campbell's Soup and Mount Olive Pickles in the past, FLOC is aiming squarely at the major tobacco buyer, RJ Reynolds. FLOC is seeking to create a multi party process between Reynolds, the growers they buy from and the workers who labor in the fields, to ensure that all parties have fair representation in the supply chain.



FLOC envisions the day when agribusiness cannot threaten to move to the next state, or even overseas, because workers everywhere will be linked with one another in solidarity fighting for dignity and justice.



Farmworkers are exercising their power to make structural changes in the agricultural industry. Without a union for farmworkers, corporate processors have almost all the power, growers have very little, and farmworkers have none. With a union, processors and growers recognize that workers have legitimate interests and the right to protect those interests. Unionized farmworkers no longer have to quietly accept pay and conditions that are dictated by corporate processors.
