It is especially important in North Carolina as one of the few states where many farmworkers are covered by a collective bargaining agreement, which means that farmworkers have the right to have a safe and reliable, well-paying work environment. The loss of these farms means the loss of their jobs.

Farm Aid understands that small farms are the backbone of America's economic system. Farmers and farmworkers deserve fair compensation for a hard day's work. This requires creating a sustainable supply chain where the products of small farmers can compete on the global market and where the dignity and respect of farmworkers is not only acknowledged, but valued.
